Week 15: December 18-22, 2022. Message from the Grade 5 Team:

- **ELA:** "What is justice?" That is the big question we are exploring in this unit. To answer it, we are reading, writing, and talking about fairness and human rights. Be a part of our exploration! With your student, read the new vocabulary words and try to use some of the new words in your interviews.
- Math: In this unit students will learn how to add and subtract using concrete models or drawings and strategies. Students will apply their understanding of the meaning of operations using whole numbers to decimals. They will be extending previous experiences with place value understanding to adding, subtracting decimals. Students will focus on place value understanding to allow them to determine whether answers are reasonable.
- Science: In Science we will continue with our Unit 4. We began our unit learning that all living organisms are classified into groups based on very basic, shared characteristics. Reproduction is the production of offspring. The ability to reproduce is another characteristic of living things. This week we will learn about physical and behavioural adaptations that help organisms survive.
